Dr. Rassias Earns 1960 Alumni Citation For Distinguished College Teaching Performance

Dr. John A. Rassias, a 1950 graduate now Assistant Professor of Foreign Languages at U.B., will receive the University alumni citation at the Sixth Annual Reunion dance Saturday, October 8.

The dance will take place between 9 p.m.-1 a.m. in the Race Brook Country Club, Orange, Connecticut. An "Alumnus of the Year" award, to be announced, will also be presented during brief intermission ceremonies.

A special dinner for the 10-Year Graduating class, of which Dr. Rassias is a member, will precede the dance in the club. R. T. "Bud" Harris is chairman and special reservation forms will be sent to class members.

According to alumni president John Cox, "Dr. Rassias was selected because of his inspired and untiring effort to enrich both the intellectual and personal development of countless alumni by distinguished college classroom instruction." In addition to receiving the award, he will become a permanent member of

the Alumni Executive Board in the dual capacity of alumni education chairman and faculty advisor to the alumni association.

Garbelnick Reunion Chairman

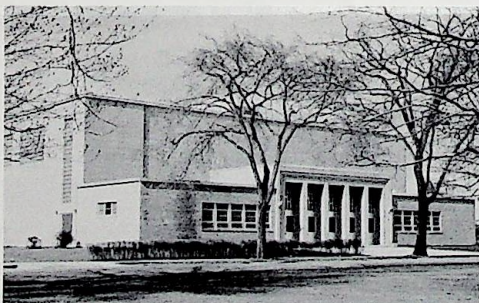

The affair is open to alumni everywhere, although more than 25 selected alumni living in the Metropolitan area, Westchester County, New Jersey, and Long Island have received names for contact work among recent graduates in several communities.
