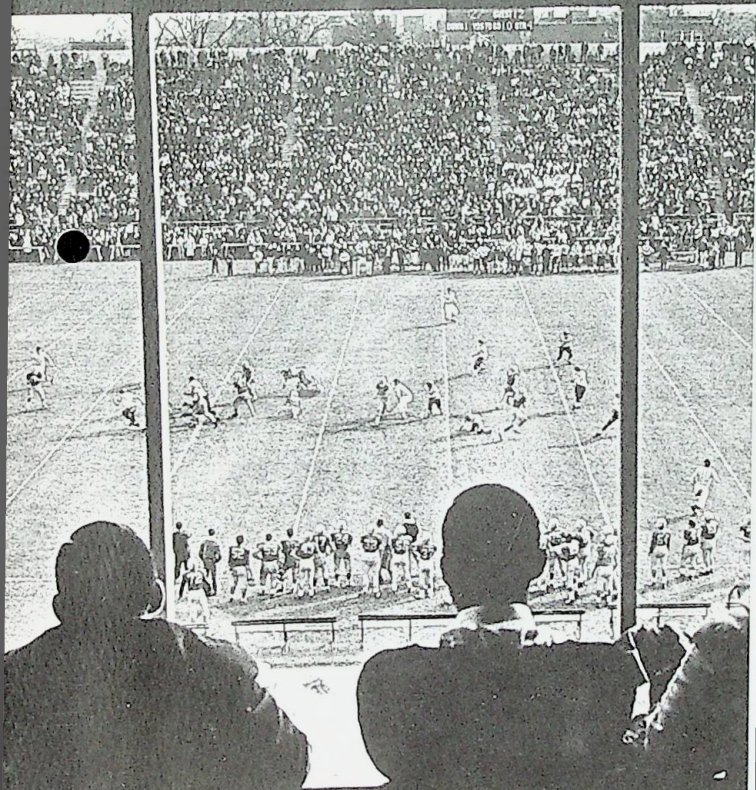

THE UNIVERSITY

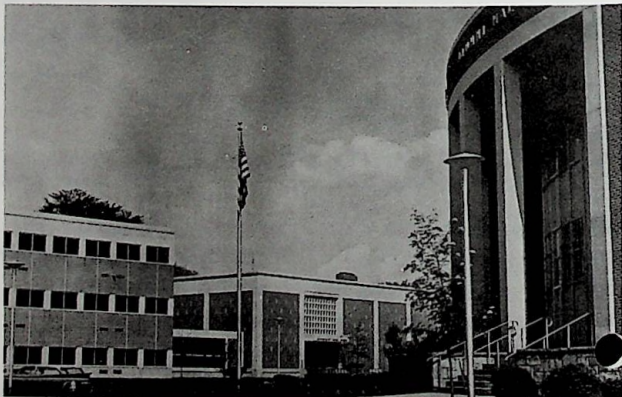


HISTORY: The University of Bridgeport is a private, coeducational, non-sectarian institution of higher learning which provides a diversified program of undergraduate and graduate education. Founded in 1927, facilities currently include 53 buildings on a 65-acre campus with a total valuation in excess of \$22,000,000. The University is comprised of nine colleges and divisions which cover the fields of arts and science, business administration, dental hygiene, education (including the Arnold College division of physical education), engineering, nursing, and secretarial studies.

LOCATION: The University of Bridgeport is located in the city of Bridgeport, Connecticut. Its beautiful campus borders on municipal Seaside Park and Long Island Sound. UB is easily reached by automobile via either the Connecticut Turnpike (Exit 27) or the Merritt Parkway (Exit 47), by bus and by train. Bridgeport is 56 miles North of New York City and 22 miles south of New Haven.

The emergence of a commanding and capable quarterback could give the University of Bridgeport football team its finest offensive punch in recent years. Ten of 11 offensive starters are returning from last season's 3-6 team, all except for quarterback John Corr.

Coach Nick Nicolau has converted defensive end John Hulme to quarterback, where he will be working with John Santos, a recent junior college quarterback.

Three king-sized newcomers are on hand to help pint-sized Paul "The Mite-ty Knight" Mandeville and veterans Fran Hutchins and John Buckman with the running chores. They are sophomores Bob Riggio and John Howe and junior college graduate Stan Mosiej. All stand six-foot or better and weigh over 200 pounds.

Mandeville, a 5-3, 140-pound senior, has led the team in ground-gaining for two straight seasons. His career rushing average is close to five yards per carry.

Up front, ends Steve Vining and Mike McDonald, tackles Joe DeFonce and Bob Messinger, guards Tom Allaire and Steve Solarsh and center Ed Ackerman are all veterans. Vining and McDonald caught 50 passes and seven touchdown aeriels between them last year.

Pressing for starting positions will be newcomers Dennis Moran at guard; Craig Peters at tackle and veteran reserve Pat Carroll at end.

On defense, linebackers Pete Noyes and Vern Lee Hoggatt, middle guard Jeff Hazeltine and halfback and team captain Frank Vino are back, but replacements will have to be found at seven other spots.

The most promising candidates are converted linebacker Wayne Bonfietti and sophomore Jim Quinn at ends; Joe Peterson and veteran Vin Curriemma at tackles; Jack Reh and Dick Williams at linebacker; and Pete Pelissier, Wes DuBois and Norman Teague in the defensive backfield.

Jacob Har-Zui will be depended upon for field goals and extra points while quarterbacks John Hulme and Joe Santos will do the punting.

Dr. Anthero (Nick) Nicolau couldn't have asked for a happier debut as head coach of the University of Bridgeport football team than last year's season-opening 14-6 win over Northeastern.

Nicolau was carried off the field on the shoulders of his players which must be some sort of a record for a coach in his first game.

Unfortunately, this happiness wasn't to last as the Purple Knights fell just short in many of their other contests to finish with a 3-6 record. Coach Nicolau termed it an "almost season" and feels the heartbreaking losses will be turned into victories during the upcoming campaign.

A tireless worker, the New Bedford, Mass. native has not stinted in his efforts to build a winning football program at Bridgeport. His job hasn't been restricted to strategy planning and recruiting alone.

Nicolau has spent many hours counselling players, speaking to campus student organizations, and talking to fellow faculty and staff members all with the distinct purpose of making football an integral part of the total Bridgeport school picture.

The talented coach made giant strides in this area last year as the interest in football on campus and attendance at games was the highest in recent years.

Nicolau is one of the state's most popular after-dinner speakers and is noted for his wit. As he says: "After you have a 3-6 season, you better be funny."

Although only 33 years old, Nicolau has a wealth of football experience. The UB head coach previously served as an assistant coach at Southern Connecticut State College, his Alma Mater, and Springfield College, as well as high schools in New Bedford and Wareham, Mass. Nicolau joined the UB football staff as assistant coach in 1962.

Nicolau started as a freshman on the Southern Connecticut defensive platoon which broke a small college team record in 1951. He then moved to offensive halfback where he was the team's leading ground gainer in 1952 and regular in 1953.

After two years out for a tour of duty in the Marine corps, Nicolau returned to college in time for the 1956 season, and was a member of Southern's finest team in history, an undefeated squad which posted a 9-0 record.

Nicolau holds a bachelor's degree from Southern Connecticut, a master's degree from the University of Indiana, and a doctoral degree in physical education which he received from Springfield College. He is an assistant professor in the Arnold College division of physical education at UB.

Nicolau and his wife, the former Eleanor Weiss of Stratford, Conn. are the parents of five children. Tracey, eight, Duane, six, Shari, five, Vickie, four, and Wendy, one. The Nicolaus live in Trumbull.

ED FARRELL, Head Line Coach

Farrell's talented coaching made Bridgeport one of the hardest-hitting and highly-respected teams in the region last year. The 32-year-old mentor compiled outstanding records in improving gridiron fortunes at Quilderland Central high school in Quilderland, N.Y. from 1961-64 and at Cambridge high school in Cambridge, Md. from 1958-60. He took over teams which had losing traditions and immediately converted them into winners. Farrell played on the football teams at Rutgers University from 1953-55. He graduated in 1956 with a bachelor of science degree and received his master's degree from New York University in 1961. Farrell is married and lives with his wife, Margaret (Meg) and their two children in Trumbull.

DICK PACELLE, Head Freshman Coach

Pacelle was a three-year starter at halfback at Southern Connecticut State College and was a co-captain of the Owls' 1954 gridiron squad. The new frosh mentor has been teaching in the Milford public school system for 11 years and served as an assistant football coach at Milford high in 1959, 1960 and 1963 and at Jonathan Law high last season. The 37-year-old coach is married and he and his wife, Patricia, and their four children, live in New Haven.

PHIL JANARO, Assistant Backfield Coach

Although he never played collegiate football, Janaro has a tremendous knowledge and grasp of the game. He attended King's College in New York which doesn't have a football team, but the 27-year-old former Hawthorne, N.Y. gridder kept active by helping coach scholastic teams in the Westchester area. Janaro is working towards a master's degree at Bridgeport. He is single.

RICK MCNAMARA, Assistant Line Coach

Rick McNamara was a three-year starter at center and middle linebacker for the Purple Knights. The Danbury native was selected on the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) season-long All-East team as a junior and made the UPI All-Connecticut team in his senior year. McNamara was captain of the 1964 UB team. The 23-year-old coach is married to the former Virginia West, an ex-head cheerleader at the school, and the couple lives on the UB campus.

FRANK PROSEK, Assistant Line Coach

Prosek was the most honored football player on last year's Bridgeport team. He was chosen as one of the defensive ends on the UPI All New England team and was named to the All Eastern Football Conference squad. He also was selected as the Purple Knights' top defensive lineman. The former New Rochelle, N.Y. high school star has a position teaching in the city of Bridgeport's elementary school system. He is single.

RED ADANTI, Assistant Line Coach

Adanti served as captain of the 1962 Southern Connecticut football team and was an assistant coach at Ansonia high school for the last three years. The Ansonia native was named the most valuable lineman at SCSC in 1962. He was the college's senior athlete of the year for the '62-'63 term. Adanti is a guidance counselor at Ansonia high school. He is married and he and his wife, Linda, live in Ansonia.

President of senior class and a member of National Honor Society... Majoring in business administration, but hopes to be a coach.

Lindenhurst, N.Y.

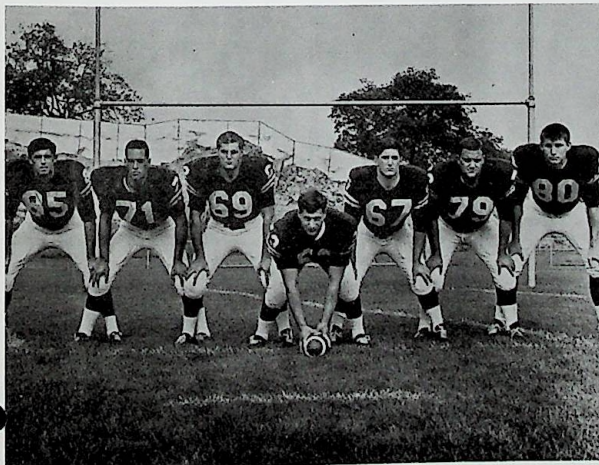
