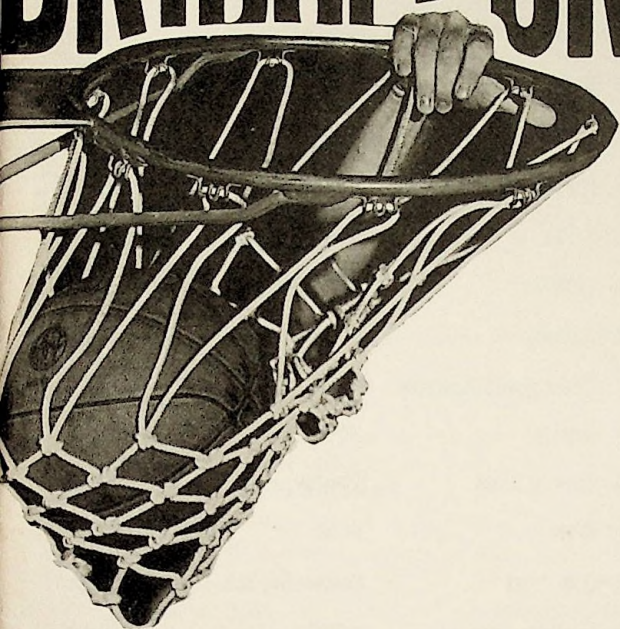

THE OUTLOOK



A transition year faces the University of Bridgeport basketball team this season under new head coach Bruce Webster.

Only one starter, forward and high scorer Bill O'Dowd, returns from the Purple Knights' 1964-65 team, and Webster plans to rebuild the squad around a group of relative newcomers.

The new coach feels that patience will have to be a virtue with UB basketball fans this season. He isn't anticipating any miracles, but does expect continual improvement from his players.

"Our best game will not be played in December," he says. "It'll come in February."

In O'Dowd, Webster does inherit one proven offensive weapon. The 6-3 senior averaged 17.7 points per game last season and soared over the 20-point plateau in nine different games. His high was a 31-point outpouring against Hofstra.

O'Dowd also is the leading returning scorer in the Tri-State Collegiate Basketball League, comprised of nine highly-rated small college teams from the New York, New Jersey, Connecticut area. The senior stalwart scored at a 20.7 per-game clip and finished third to since-graduated Steve Nisensen, Hofstra, and Hank Pedro, Wagner, in the league scoring race.

O'Dowd will team up front with either 6-1 junior Bob Weissler or 6-2 sophomore Bob Miller, the number one scorers on the school's last two freshmen teams.

Weissler, who throws his one-handed jump shot up with uncanny accuracy, smashed all UB freshman scoring records two years ago as he poured in 522 points for a 24.9 per-game average. A pre-season ankle injury kept Weissler on the sidelines nearly all of last year although he did see limited service in the team's final six games. His return to action is expected to give a big boost to the Knights' attack and keep the defense from doubling up on O'Dowd.

Miller parlayed a fine jumper into a 16.2 average for the 1964-65 UB frosh quintet. He capped a stellar season with a 25-point performance against arch-rival Fairfield University.

Center is still a question mark for the Knights with junior Howie Ross and sophomore Tom Hessel vying for the starting assignment. Ross and Hessel are the tallest players on the team at 6-5 and will be counted on more for rebounding than for scoring.

Reserves in the forecourt include 6-4 sophomore Stan Koczka, 6-2 sophomore Alan Brenner, who also can play guard, and 6-2 senior Pete Greenwald.

The team's starting backcourt will be chosen among sophomore Ken Kaufman, junior Joe Dwyer and senior Frank Pambello. All three guards stand 5-10 and are pepper-pot types who can spark the club's attack with their speed and hustle and also fire Webster's aggressive, pressing brand of defense.

Pambello, the number one point producer on the school's 1961-62 freshman team, returns to the court after a three-year absence. Dwyer was a top-line reserve and averaged five points per game last season. Kaufman, a graduate of Leicester Junior College, has already been tabbed as a possible take-charge man who can run the offensive show. Elliot Fink, a 6-0 junior, will lend support at guard.

The 1965-66 University of Bridgeport basketball team will play a 24-game schedule, highlighted by participation in the rugged Tri-State Collegiate Basketball league.

The Purple Knights will open their campaign Dec. 1 against always powerful Iona College in New Rochelle, N.Y. The home opener will be against St. Francis of Brooklyn, Dec. 4.

Listed on the slated are 14 home games including contests against three state rivals, Fairfield, Coast Guard and Southern Connecticut. Four league opponents, Adelphi, Long Island University, Fairleigh Dickinson and Rider, will visit the UB gym along with St. Anselm's, American International College, Springfield, Suffolk, Merrimack, Marist and St. Francis.

Away games will match the UB cagers against state foes Fairfield, in the second game of the annual home-and-home set, Central Connecticut and Hartford, league teams CCNY, C.W. Post, Hofstra and Wagner plus Yeshiva, Trenton State and Iona.

Suffolk, Trenton State and C.W. Post, a new league entrant, are the only new opponents.

The schedule is well-balanced with never more than two away games in a row and should provide an interesting test for the UB courtmen under new head coach Bruce Webster.

Dr. Herbert E. Glines

Director of Athletics



Dr. Herbert E. Glines is the "Father of Sports" and basketball at the University of Bridgeport. He has served as the school's athletic director since the school gained University status in 1947. He also coached basketball at UB for 13 years before relinquishing the post in 1960.

Dr. Glines' teams compiled an impressive record of 138 wins against 134 defeats, not including the 1947-48 season when squads were fielded on both a Junior College and varsity level, and not including Alumni contests.

Three of Dr. Glines' teams battled their way into the New England NAIA district playoffs, finishing first in 1954, second in 1953 and third in 1952. The Purple Knights represented New England in the National NAIA tournament in Kansas City in 1954, but lost in the first round.

Dr. Glines' best squad may have been in 1951-52 when the UB cagers posted a 19-7 record and also won "exhibition" contests over the New York Athletic club and the Alumni team for a total of 21 victories.

Dr. Glines' final team in 1959-60 also was one of his finest. The Knights finished with a 14-7 record that season and tied for the Tri-State league championship, losing a tournament berth in a special playoff with Fairfield University.

As athletic director, Dr. Glines oversees an ever-expanding intercollegiate sports program. The university fields teams in nine sports, football, soccer, basketball, wrestling, baseball, track and field, cross country, tennis and golf with freshman teams also competing in most of them.

Dr. Glines is a 1941 graduate of the University of New Hampshire where he played football, basketball and lacrosse. He was twice picked on the all New England lacrosse squad. He received his master's and doctorate degrees from Columbia university and is a professor in the mathematics department of the university.

Dr. Glines is married and he and his wife, Anne, are the parents of three sons, Gene and Tom, both students at UB, and Kenneth. The Glines live in Stratford.

Bruce Webster

Head Coach



If all the Bridgeport team members put as much desire and dedication into their play as new coach Bruce Webster does into his coaching, the Purple Knights can't help but have an improved season.

This was the gist of a comment by one of the school's administrators who recently watched Webster working in one of the pre-season drills.

The 28-year-old Mentor has the type of sports background which one might expect in a man as energetic and hard-working as he is. The Long Island native was a three-sport star in both high school and at Rutgers University, a sports feat which is rapidly disappearing in this age of specialization.

Webster was the recipient of the Hill Memorial Award as the outstanding basketball player at Rutgers in 1958. He served as team captain in 1959 and was picked on the New York All Stars in the same year at guard.

Webster also played four years of football at Rutgers as a quarterback and tailback and received All East honorable mention recognition in 1958. In addition, he was an infielder on the school's baseball squad for four years.

The former Mineola, L.I. high school standout served as head freshman basketball coach at Rutgers from 1959 through 1964, with the exception of the 1961 season when he taught physical education and helped with the athletic program at the U.S. Military Academy, West Point during an Army stint.

The 1964 Rutgers freshman team finished with a 14-5 record, best in the school's history. Webster's overall coaching record is 55-34, for a fine .618 winning percentage.

Webster holds a bachelor's and master's degree in physical education from Rutgers. He is presently teaching in the Arnold College division of physical education at the university.

Webster is married and he and his wife, Judy, and their one-year-old son, live in Monroe.

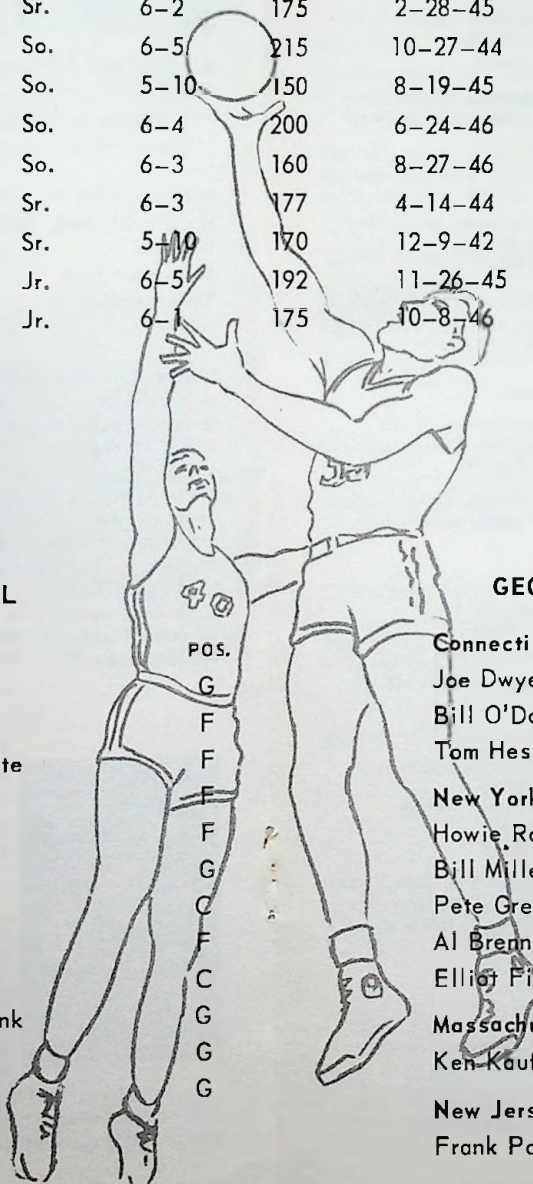

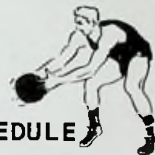


Tom McCarthy
