MRS. ELEANOR ROOSEVELT is the former senior United States delegate to the General Assembly of the United Nations and widow of the late Franklin D. Roosevelt. In 1946 she was appointed to membership on the Human Rights Commission of the UN and was the recent recipient of the B'nai B'rith "Humanitarian Award" for her "selfless devotion in furthering world peace and understanding."

Beginning with the first World War, she became active in civic affairs and in the period between 1927 and 1930, the former first lady was part owner and taught history and current events at a girls' private school. During the second World War, she visited American Troops in Eng-

land and in the South Pacific and devoted special attention to the work being done by the women in these areas.

She was elected chairman of the Nuclear Commission meeting in Geneva, Switzerland, and reelected to that post every year until she declined in 1951. She has been the only U.S. delegate to attend every session of the General Assembly. Because of the illness of the ambassador to the Security Council, Mrs. Roosevelt served in the 1951 Assembly in Paris as head of the U.S. Delegation. In October 1952, she went to Chile as head of the U.S. mission to the inauguration of President Carlos Ibanez.

Well known as a radio and television commentator and columnist, Mrs. Roosevelt is the author of several books including two volumes of her autobiography, "This Is My Story" and "This I Remember."

FRANK JACOBY established in Bridgeport the Frank Jacoby Foundation, Inc., to foster the spirit of brotherhood among men regardless of race, color, or creed. The Foundation has endowed this lecture series at the University of Bridgeport to bring to its campus each year an outstanding national figure for a public lecture on the "Brotherhood of Man". The series was initiated in 1952 with Dr. Ralph J. Bunche, director of the Department of Trusteeship of the United Nations, as guest speaker.

Born in Hungary, Mr. Jacoby came to Bridgeport in 1894 and became one of the city's pioneer clothing and furniture merchants as well as one of its outstanding philanthropists.

His memory is being perpetuated not only by the many civic, fraternal, and charitable organizations in which he was an active participant and by the University of Bridgeport lecture series, but also by an annual essay contest in the Bridgeport high schools on the subject of Human Equality.
