April 28: Fifty professional designers from the tri-state area gathered in the Schelfhault Gallery to be introduced to SASD's Master of Professional Studies (MPS), Design Management, program, considering the proposition that "Design management represents a strategic asset. Design management develops disruptive business ideas that improve productivity, create innovative products, lower operational costs, and create a sustainable work environment." A panel moderated by Prof. **Alex White**, chair of SASD's MPS program, included Dan Dittmar, director of brand design at BIG; John Almstead, senior industrial designer at Unilever HPC; Paula Grant, founding partner of Flood Creative (which creates and develops beverages for CocaCola and others); and **Brian Miller**, designer and UB MPS professor. The event was co-sponsored with UB by the American Institute of Graphic Arts-MetroNorth, the largest design association in America.

ATHLETICS

Allie Wiggins, a freshman, was named, for the second time this season, ECC Women's Lacrosse Rookie of the Week, on April 22.

Sydney Phillips, a sophomore, earned 2013 First Team All-East Coast Conference Softball honors May 3. She achieved a .356 batting average, 4 home runs, and 18 runs batted in, playing in 48 of the team's 50 games this season.

ENGINEERING

Their analysis of the medical data showed that the man was killed by 2 entirely different types of electrocution, leading to both asphyxiation and ventricular fibrillation. Their work enabled the widow to collect an extra half-million dollars in addition to her husband's wrongful death settlement of a million dollars.
