

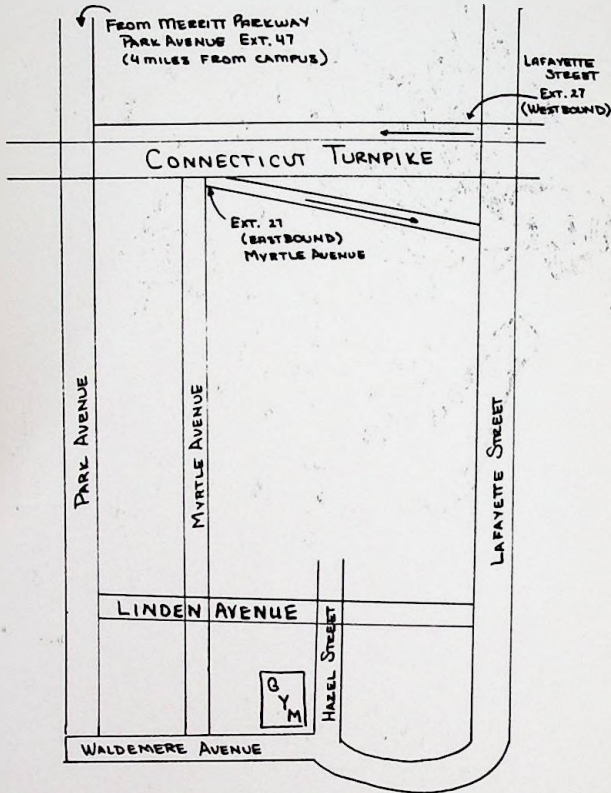

HOW TO REACH UB GYMNASIUM:



DIRECTIONS TO GYMNASIUM. Connecticut Turnpike from direction of New York, Myrtle Avenue Exit (No. 27), continue along side Turnpike, two blocks to Lafayette Street, turn right. Continue to dead end at Park. Turn right. Gym in one block. **FROM DIRECTION OF NEW HAVEN,** Lafayette Street Exit (No. 27), continue along side of Turnpike to Park Avenue. Turn left. Continue one-half mile to arch at entrance to Park (Waldemere Avenue). Turn left. Gym in one block. **FROM MERRITT PARKWAY** (East or West), Park Avenue (Exit 47). Turn south on Park Avenue. Continue approximately four miles to arch at entrance to Park. Turn left. Gym one block in.

THE OUTLOOK

The University of Bridgeport basketball team could be a "sleeper" in Eastern collegiate basketball circles this season.

The Purple Knights have five veterans returning from last year's squad including three starters, but the key to the team's hopes may be the performance of a host of talented newcomers.

Sophomores **GARY BAUM**, **BOB FAUSER** and **TONY BARONE** were the sparkplugs on Bridgeport's 1965-66 freshman team which posted a 16-5 record, best in the school's history. Another key addition to the squad will be **BOB BRILL**, a transfer student from Rutgers.

Brill and Barone should battle it out with returning starters **KEN KAUFMAN**, the team's second leading scorer last season, and **JOE DWYER** for the starting berths at guard. No matter which two emerge as first-stringers, Coach **BRUCE WEBSTER** still feels the backcourt will be the team's main strength.

Baum has been converted from forward to center for the upcoming campaign. He was the top point-producer on last season's freshman club with a 19.8 per-game average. Much of the Purple Knights' success will depend on how well the 6-6 sophomore handles the major rebounding chores.

Fausser and letterman **BOB WEISSLER**, who averaged 19.0 points per game over the second half of last season, are the leading candidates for the two forward posts. They will be counted on to take up the scoring slack left by the graduation of Bill O'Dowd, who broke the school single season scoring record with 517 points which included a record 217 field goals.

Letterman **BOB MILLER** and newcomer **JOHN McDONNELL** also are in contention for starting spots at forward. At center, letterman **TOM HESSEL** and sophomores **TOM FINN**, **RICK WEST** and **PAUL LEGRANDE** will be ready to take over if Baum should falter.

Webster guided the Purple Knights to a 9-15 record during the 1965-66 season which included an 8-8 mark after the holiday break. The second-year coach foresees an improved record this season with the prospects bright that the UB team will surpass the .500 mark.

DR. HERBERT E. GLINES

Director of Athletics



Dr. Herbert E. Glines is the "Father of Sports" and basketball at the University of Bridgeport. He has served as the school's athletic director since the school gained University status in 1947. He also coached basketball at UB for 13 years before relinquishing the post in 1960.

Dr. Glines' teams compiled an impressive record of 138 wins against 134 defeats, not including the 1947-48 season when squads were fielded on both a Junior College and varsity level, and not including Alumni contests.

Three of Dr. Glines' teams battled their way into the New England NAIA district playoffs, finishing first in 1954, second in 1953 and third in 1952. The Purple Knights represented New England in the National NAIA tournament in Kansas City in 1954, but lost in the first round.

Dr. Glines' best squad may have been in 1951-52 when the UB cagers posted a 19-7 record and also won "exhibition" contests over the New York Athletic club and the Alumni team for a total of 21 victories.

Dr. Glines' final team in 1959-60 also was one of his finest. The Knights finished with a 14-7 record that season and tied for the Tri-State League championship, losing a tournament berth in a special playoff with Fairfield University.

As athletic director, Dr. Glines oversees an ever-expanding intercollegiate sports program. The university fields teams in nine sports — football, soccer, basketball, wrestling, baseball, track and field, cross country, tennis and golf — with freshman teams also competing in most of them.

Dr. Glines is a 1941 graduate of the University of New Hampshire where he played football, basketball and lacrosse. He was twice picked on the all-New England lacrosse squad. He received his master's and doctorate degrees from Columbia University and is a professor in the mathematics department of the university.

Dr. Glines is married and he and his wife, Anne, are the parents of three sons, Gene, Tom and Kenneth. The Glines live in Stratford.

BRUCE WEBSTER

Head Coach

One measure of an athletic coach's skill is how much his team improves over the course of a season. In this respect, the 1965-66 University of Bridgeport basketball campaign gave a good indication of the tremendous coaching talent of Bruce Webster.



After a slow start, the Purple Knights came on strongly under Webster's tutelage to post an 8-8 record after the holiday break which included a number of impressive victories.

When he took the Bridgeport head coaching job, Webster predicted that his first team's best games "would come in February." His prediction came true.

This season, the 28-year-old mentor feels the Knights will improve greatly over their 1965-66 record of 9-15. If coaching, dedication and skill have anything to do with it, Webster should be right again.

The youthful mentor has the type of sports background which one might expect in a man as energetic as he is. The Long Island native was a three-sport star in both high school and at Rutgers University.

Webster was the recipient of the Hill Memorial Award as the outstanding basketball player at Rutgers in 1958. He served as team captain in 1959 and was picked on the New York All-Stars in the same year at guard.

Webster also played four years of football and baseball at Rutgers.

The former Mineola, L.I. high school standout served as head freshman basketball coach at Rutgers from 1959 through 1964, with the exception of the 1961 season when he taught physical education and helped with the athletic program at the U.S. Military Academy, West Point, during an Army stint.

Webster holds a bachelor's and master's degree in physical education from Rutgers. He is presently teaching in the Arnold College division of physical education at the university.

Webster is married and he and his wife, Judy, and their two-year-old son, live in Monroe.

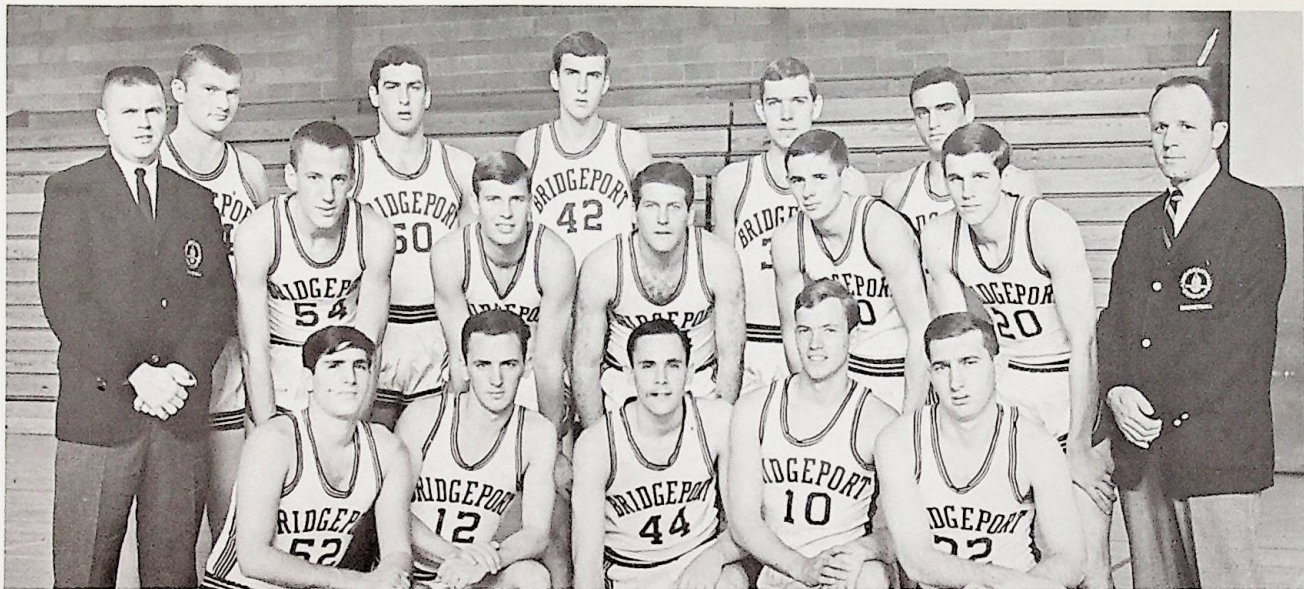
