Coach Bruce Webster

UB's legendary head basketball coach passed away at the age of 80 on April 26. Coach Webster led Purple Knights basketball for 34 seasons, from the 1965-66 campaign through the 1998-99 season. During his tenure UB teams posted 549 wins, making him UB's all-time leader in career victories. Under his direction the Purple Knights made a total of 12 NCAA National Tournament appearances, won 5 NCAA Regional titles, and reached the NCAA Division II National Championship Game in 1991 and 1992. In recognition of Coach Webster's contributions to UB basketball, in February 2005 the University named the playing court in Hubbell Gym in his honor. 107TH COMMENCEMENT CEREMONY

On May 6, more than 1,500 undergraduate and graduate degrees were conferred upon those gathered in the Webster Bank Arena. The Doctor of Humane Letters, Honoris Causa, was awarded to Trustee *Ernest C. Trefz* (posthumously) and to *Ramon Elpidio Peralta '93*, the Commencement speaker. *Louise Ovner '17* spoke as the student representative. The ceremonies were live-streamed and received 16,000 hits from locations around the world.

The following morning, diplomas were awarded in a ceremony at the Bernhard Center to 150 who had earned graduate degrees in the health sciences.
